#### Computer-Based Released Items Grade 7 MCAS English Language Arts Spring 2023

The spring 2023 grade 7 English Language Arts test was administered in two formats: a computer-based version and a paper-based version. Most students took the computer-based test. The paper-based test was offered as an accommodation for eligible students who were unable to use a computer.

The Department of Elementary and Secondary Education is releasing items from both versions of the test to provide information about the knowledge and skills that students are expected to demonstrate.

- Released items from the **computer-based test** are available online at <u>mcas.pearsonsupport.com/released-items</u>. The computer-based released items are collected in a mini test called an ePAT (electronic practice assessment tool). Items in the ePAT are displayed in TestNav 8, the testing platform for the computer-based tests.

This document provides information about each released item from the *computer-based test*, including the following: reporting category, standard(s) covered, item type, item description, and correct answer (for released selected-response items only). #### A Note about Testing Mode

Most of the operational items on the grade 7 ELA test were the same, regardless of whether a student took the computer-based version or the paper-based version. In places where a technology-enhanced item was used on the computer-based test, an adapted version of the item was created for use on the paper test. These adapted paper items were multiple-choice or multiple-select items that tested the same ELA content and assessed the same standard as the technology-enhanced item.

## Correct Answer for CBT Item #11: Technology-Enhanced Item

"Here There Be Jaguars" and "Creature Close-Up" **both** focus on animal protection v. However, "Here There Be Jaguars" **mainly** describes the process of scientific study v., while "Creature Close-Up" focuses **mainly** on highlighting a crisis for animals.
